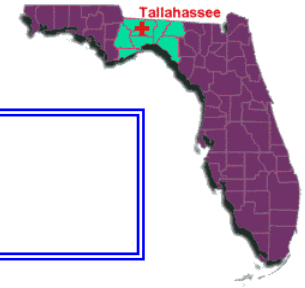


# Capital Area Chapter American Red Cross Situation Report # 1 - 06/03/06 9:00AM

## Hurricane Zoe

### Damage Assessment (Information Management Support Services – Disaster Assessment)

#### Impact Assessment:

- On-line Damage Assessment web site ([www.tallytown.com/redcross/DamageAssessment.html](http://www.tallytown.com/redcross/DamageAssessment.html)) has been activated.
- Seven (7) Damage Assessment Teams have been deployed to neighborhoods throughout Leon County.
- Two (2) additional Damage Assessment Teams are on stand-by at the chapter's EOC to do Hot Shots as needed.

#### Needs Assessment:

- American Red Cross Government Liaisons in each of the county EOCs are working to gather Essential Elements of Information so an Incident Action Plan can be developed to meet the human needs of the disaster victims.

### **Mass Care – Feeding (Community Services – Feeding)**

- Partnership with America’s Second Harvest of the Big Bend is active.
- Meals, snacks, and beverages are being provided to all open Shelters.
- A fixed feeding site has been set up at Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation in Gadsden County to prepare meals that will be delivered in Gadsden, Liberty and West Leon County. 14 Emergency Response Vehicles (ERV) will be operating out of this site.
- The Chapter’s Mobile Kitchen has been deployed to a site near the Jefferson Leon County line to serve as a fixed feeding site and to support mobile feeding operations for the residents of Jefferson, Madison and East Leon Counties.
- A fixed feeding site has been established in Taylor County at the Taylor County Elementary School.

- Meals, snacks and water have been ordered to support five (5) Emergency Aid Stations. A final locations for the Emergency Aid Stations is waiting on the completion of the Needs Assessment.
- Currently the Mass Care (Feeding) Function is working on a feeding plan and food supplies for the next seven (7) days. This plan will support the chapter's Incident Action Plan.

### **Logistics (Material Support Services & Technology)**

- Seven (7) 15-foot box trucks and two (2) 24-foot box trucks have been rented to support the Disaster Relief Operation..
- Have resources on stand by to set up five (5) Emergency Aid Stations when locations are determined.
- Currently 15 staff members with vehicles are supporting feeding operations at open Shelters.

### **Communications (Material Support Services & Technology)**

- The Jefferson County EOC's 47.42 MHz radio is operational and radio communications have been established between the chapter's EOC and that location.
- The Amateur Radio Network up and operational.
- One (1) Amateur Radio Portable Repeater is on standby and ready to be deployed if the main repeater loses power.
- Contact between the chapter's EOC and each of the county EOCs is being made VIA Amateur Radio Operators. In some area this is the only form of communications.

### **Family Services (Individual Client Services – Client Casework)**

- No Activity At This Time.

### **Disaster Health Services (Individual Client Services – Health Services)**

- Nurses have been deployed to all open Shelters.
- Nurses are being identified to support all Emergency Aid Stations.
- Currently Disaster Health Services is working with Staffing to schedule nurses for the next week at all locations (Shelters, Emergency Aid Stations, Service Centers and Disaster Relief Operations Headquarters).

### **Disaster Mental Health Services (Individual Client Services – Mental Health Services)**

- Disaster Mental Health Services staff have been dispatched to all open Shelters having populations greater than 200. On call Disaster Mental Health Services staff are available for other open Shelters and to be deployed as needed.

- The function leadership is working with staffing to identify Disaster Mental Health Services staff who will be on call for the next seven (7) days.

### **Disaster Welfare Inquiry (Individual Client Services – Welfare Information)**

- No Activity At This Time..

### **Government Liaison (Partnership Services – Government)**

- American Red Cross Government Liaison have been placed in each of the affected county EOCs.

### **Volunteer Agency Liaison (Partnership Services)**

- 211 Big Bend: The partnership has been activated with 211 Big Bend staff assigned to the chapter's EOC.
- America's Second Harvest of the Big Bend: The partnership has been activated. Warehouse space and equipment has been made available to support the chapter's Disaster Relief Operation.
- Big Bend Disaster Animal Response Team: This partnership has been activated. BBDART staff are operating a Pet Friendly Shelter co-located with the open Shelter located at Chiles High School.
- Capital Area District of the American Radio Emergency Services: This partnership has been activated. Currently Amateur Radio Operators are supporting the chapter's Communications Function.
- Volunteer Leon: This partnership has been activated. Volunteer Leon is operating a Disaster Services Volunteer Reception Center to support the chapter's Staffing Function.
- Florida Baptist: This partnership has been activated. Two (2) Baptist Chainsaw Teams are available to help neighborhoods clear debris off of homes.
- Suwannee River Area Council of the Boy Scout of America: Several Boy Scout Troops are supporting one (1) Point of Distribution being established in Gadsden County. In addition the Mass Care (Feeding) Function is utilizing Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation as a food preparation site.

### **Staffing (Staff Services – Workforce Planning & Acquisition)**

- Disaster Services Volunteer Information Hotline at 894-6735 has been activated.
- The chapter's Staffing Center has been established to support the needs of all functions.

### **Public Affairs (Organization Support – Communication & Marketing)**

- Contact has been made with all local media outlets.

### **Disaster Services Management Team (Operations Management)**

- Chapter's EOC is at a Level III Activation with 24 hour operations.
